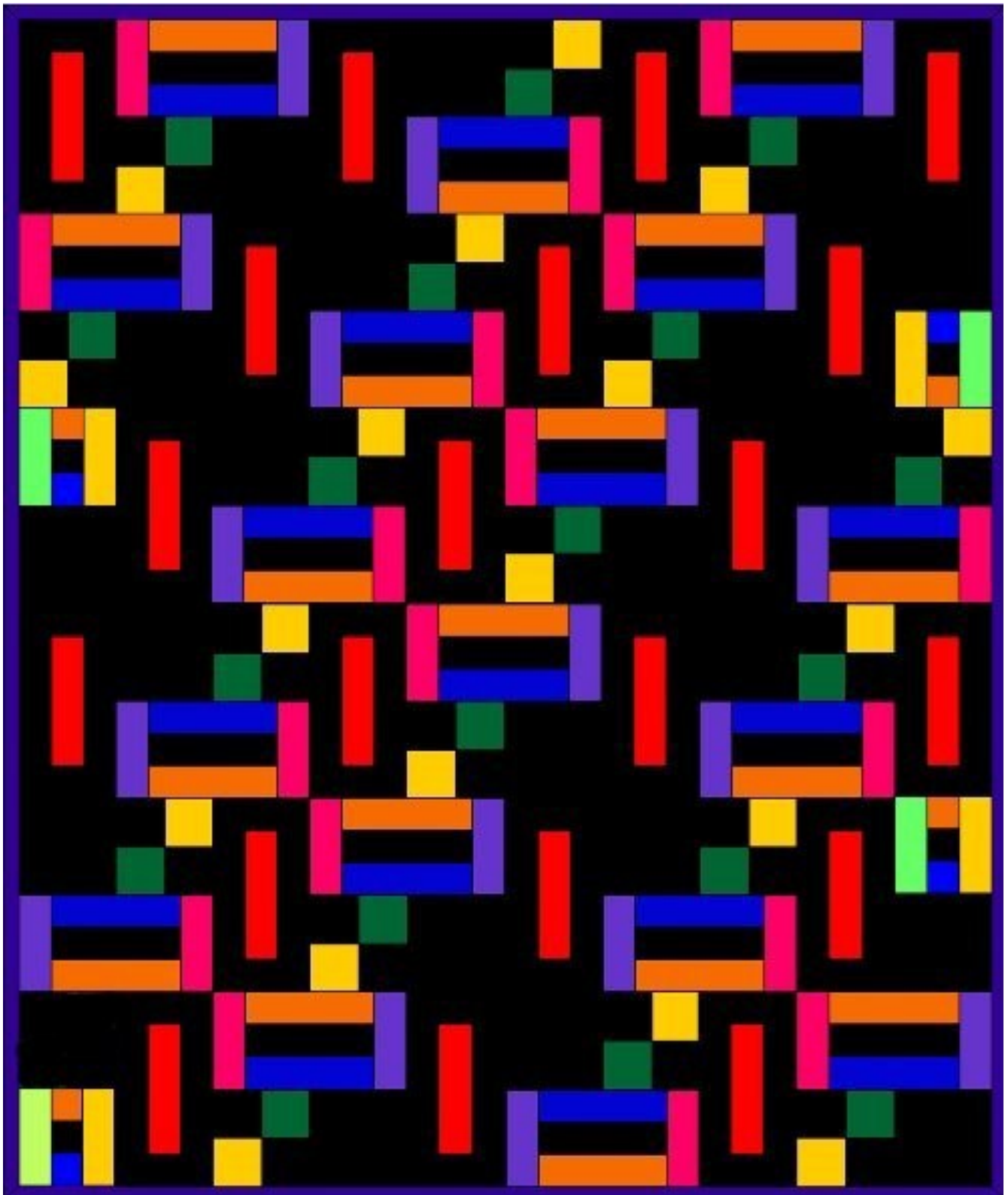


Wandering Ways Quilt Pattern

## **Fabric Requirements:**

3 yards Kona black  
½ of a yard of Red  
½ of a yard of Blue  
½ of a yard of Purple  
½ of a yard of Pink  
½ of a yard of Yellow  
½ of a yard of Orange  
½ of a yard of Green

I recommend prewashing your fabrics. I prewash all my fabrics to remove any sizing or dyes.

## **Cut the fabric as follows:**

22 - 6 ½ inch black squares  
36 - 3 ½ inch black squares  
18 - 3 ½ inch yellow squares  
18 - 3 ½ inch green squares  
20 - 2 ½ x 8 ½ inch red strips  
58 - 2 ½ x 8 ½ inch black strips  
40 - 2 ½ x 6 ½ inch black strips  
18 - 2 ½ x 8 ½ inch blue strips  
18 - 2 ½ x 8 ½ inch orange strips  
18 - 2 ½ x 6 ½ inch purple strips  
18 - 2 ½ x 6 ½ inch pink strips  
4 - 2 ½ inch black squares  
4 - 2 ½ inch blue squares  
4 - 2 ½ inch orange squares  
4 - 2 ½ x 6 ½ inch yellow strips  
4 - 2 ½ x 6 ½ inch green strips

You need to make 20 of Block 1:



Sew a black 2 ½ x 8 ½ inch strip to both sides of a red 2 ½ x 8 ½ inch strip. Then sew a 2 ½ x 6 ½ inch black strip to the top and bottom.

Make 18 of Block 2:



Sew a black  $2\frac{1}{2}$  x  $8\frac{1}{2}$  inch strip to a blue  $2\frac{1}{2}$  x  $8\frac{1}{2}$  inch strip. Sew an orange  $2\frac{1}{2}$  x  $8\frac{1}{2}$  inch strip to the other side of the black  $2\frac{1}{2}$  x  $8\frac{1}{2}$  inch strip. Sew a  $2\frac{1}{2}$  x  $6\frac{1}{2}$  inch pink strip to the left and a  $2\frac{1}{2}$  x  $6\frac{1}{2}$  inch strip of purple to the right side.

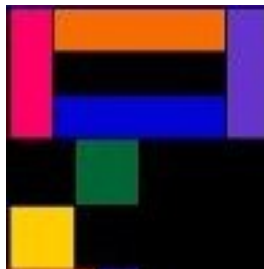
Make 18 of Block 3:



Sew a  $3\frac{1}{2}$  inch black and yellow square together. Then sew a  $3\frac{1}{2}$  inch black and green square together. Sew the strips together like the picture. Now sew a  $6\frac{1}{2}$  inch black square to the right side of this square.

Then sew block 2 to the top of block 3. It should look like this.

Block 5:



You will have 18 blocks when finished.

Make 4 of this block.



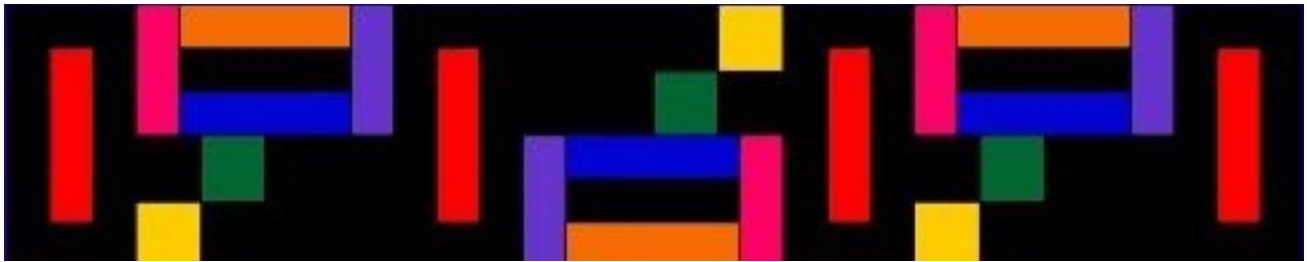
Sew a  $2\frac{1}{2}$  inch black and blue square together. Then sew a  $2\frac{1}{2}$  inch orange square to the black square. The blue square needs to be on top. Sew a  $2\frac{1}{2}$  x  $6\frac{1}{2}$  inch yellow strip to the left side of the strip and a  $2\frac{1}{2}$  x  $6\frac{1}{2}$  inch green strip on the right side. Now sew a  $6\frac{1}{2}$  inch black square to the top of this block.

Block 6:



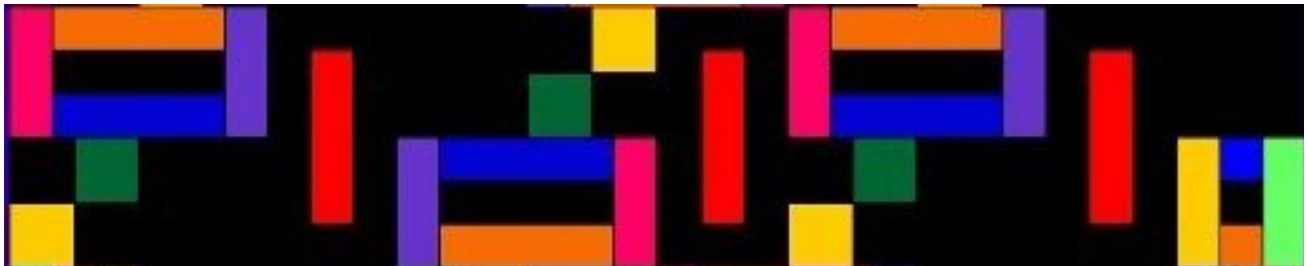
Pay close attention to how you sew the blocks together to make the rows or it won't look right.

Row 1:



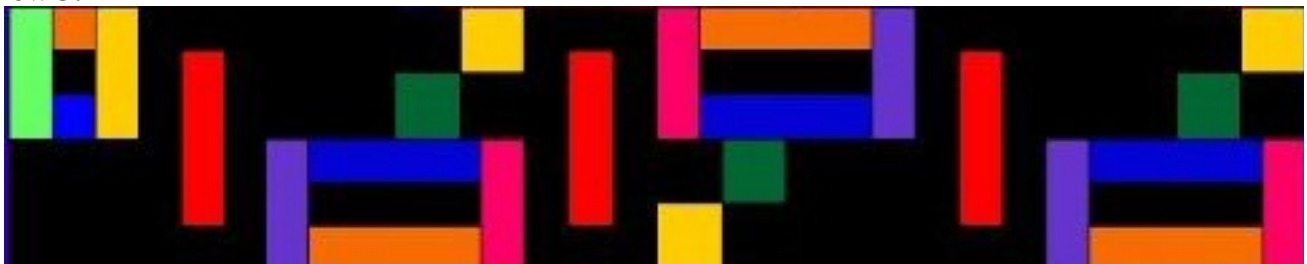
Block 1, block 5, block 1, block 5 (upside down), block 1, block 5, block 1.

Row 2:



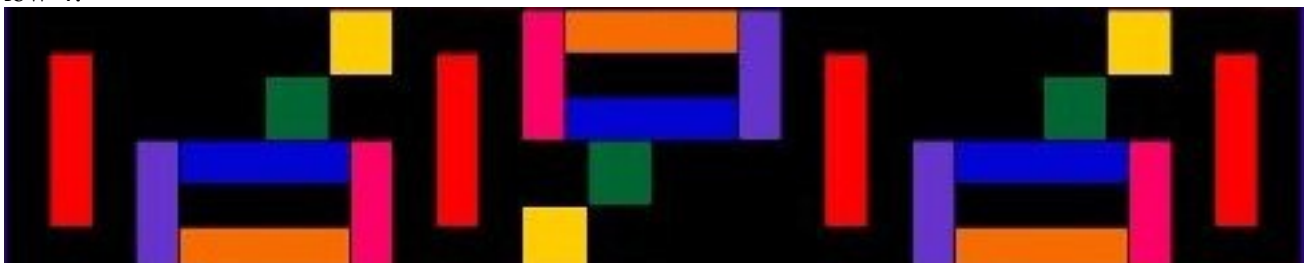
Block 5, block 1, block 5 (upside down), block 1, block 5, block 1, block 6 with black square on top.

Row 3:



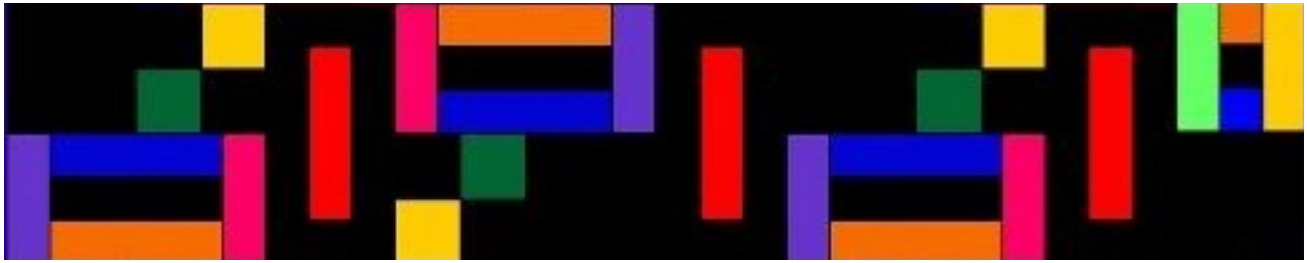
Block 6 (upside down), block 1, block 5 (upside down), block 1, block 5, block 1, block 5 (upside down).

Row 4:



Block 1, block 5 (upside down), block 1, block 5, block 1, block 5 (upside down), block 1.

Row 5:



Block 5 (upside down), block 1, block 5, block 1, block 5 (upside down), block 1, block 6 (upside down).

Row 6:



Block 6, block 1, block 5, block 1, block 5 (upside down), block 1, block 5.

Error in picture of block 6 above. It is showing the blue block on the bottom and it should be on the top in the actual quilt. The blue square will always be next to the black 6 ½ inch square.

Once you have the rows made sew them together.  
Add whatever border you like. I didn't add a border to my quilt.
